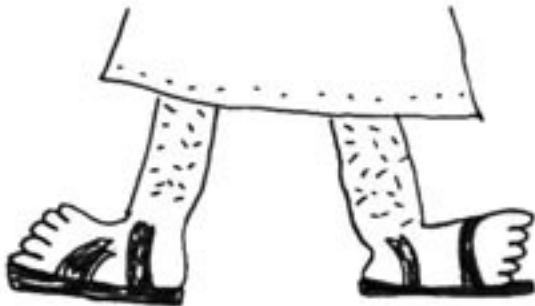




**Jesus

He goes to the big warehouse store. No luck. The style of sandal he's after is not profitable to carry.

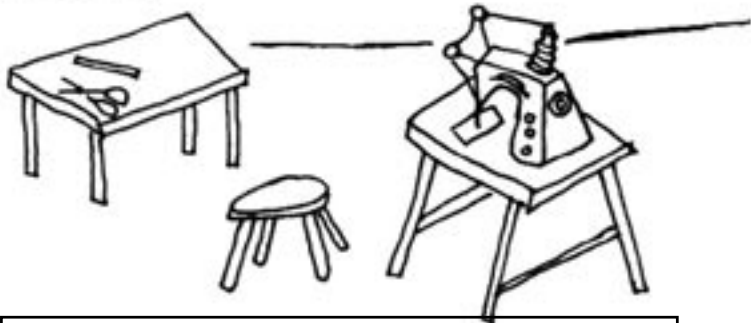
He flies to Nicaragua and visits the shoe factory.

He goes to Jerusalem, where, in a store window, he finally sees some sandals like his old ones.

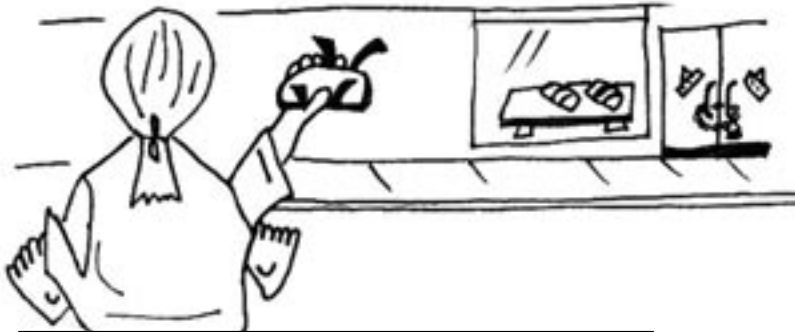


But the shop is beside a night club that was recently destroyed by a suicide bomber.
